1.1 QUALIFICATIONS

- Be a US Citizen or a non-US Citizen with lawful permanent resident status.
- Be at least 18 years old.
- Hold a basic New Jersey driver's license (Class D).
- Have at least 20/40 vision in each eye with or without glasses.
- Be physically fit.*

* Check Page 8 (Medical Conditions)



1.2 REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Proof of Legal Presence in the US (Certify at least one):

- Work Permit
- Or Green Card
- Or American Passport

Mandatory for All Applicants

- Social Security Number

Obtaining your Permit

2.1 COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

Print and fill out the Application for Commercial Driver License. This form is your ticket to getting behind the wheel, so make sure to have it ready before hitting the agency.

2.2 GATHER YOUR POINTS OF ID

Before heading to the agency, ensure you have your 6 Points of ID:

- Social Security card
- Proof of address
- Proof of legal presence in the US

2.3 SCHEDULE YOUR PERMIT APPOINTMENT

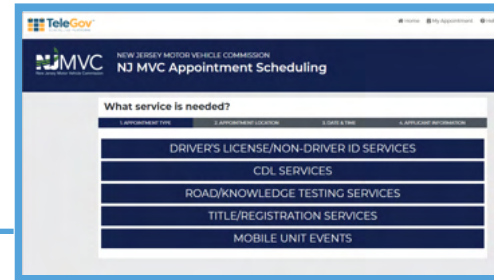
Making an appointment for your CDL permit is a smart move. It ensures a smoother process and minimizes your waiting time. Check online for available slots and secure your spot.

2.4 PREPARE FOR THE \$125 EXAMINATION TEST RECEIPT FEE

When you arrive at the agency at your scheduled time, be prepared to cover the \$125 commercial examination test receipt fee. Please note that this fee is non-refundable. You can make the payment using any of the following methods: credit card, check, money order, or cash.

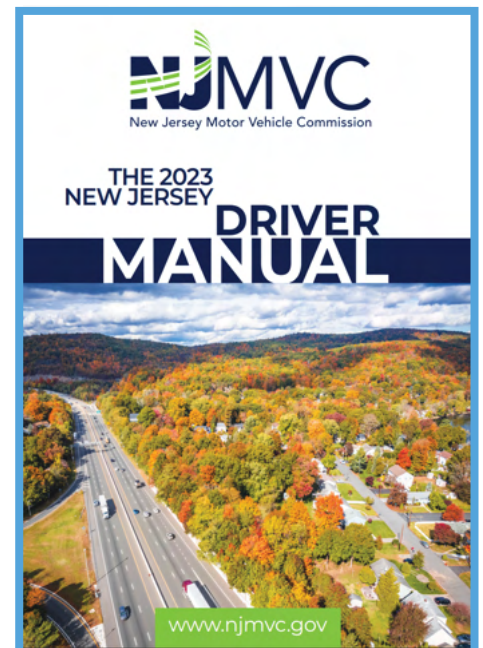

After conquering the knowledge exams, it's time to ensure you're physically fit for the road. Schedule a visit to a certified medical examiner to obtain your Medical Examiner's Certificate. This step is crucial and ensures that you meet the necessary health requirements for holding a CDL.

If you don't pass all the exams the first time, don't worry! At your next appointment, you will not need to retake the tests you have already approved.

5.3 OBTAINING YOUR CDL

Upon successfully passing all the tests, you're on the home stretch to acquiring your CDL. Visit the NJMVC to finalize the process.

Pay \$42 for the four-year CDL plus \$2 for each endorsement, and within a short period, your hard-earned CDL will be mailed directly to your house.
